Regional government organization formed in 1969 to focus on flood control along Bassett Creek.


Now also focused on improving and protecting water quality of Bassett Creek and the lakes and streams in the tributary area. Includes parts of 9 cities:

Regional Parks

- 4 major subwatersheds: Mainstem, Medicine Lake Branch (Plymouth Creek), North Branch, Sweeney Lake Branch
- Multiple lakes: Medicine, Westwood, Wirth, Twin, Sweeney, Lost, Northwood, Parkers, Turtle, Crane, others

Vision Statement:

Stewardship of water resources to protect and enhance our communities



Commission Funding:

- Contributions from 9 member cities (2013: \$515,045)
- Hennepin County tax levy for major projects (2013: \$1,000,000)
- Grant funds and permit fees (2013: \$53,000)

Commission Activities:

- Implement projects that improve and protect Bassett Creek and lakes, streams, ponds, and wetlands throughout watershed
- Monitor water quality, perform studies, map resources
- Provide water resource education to residents, businesses, local officials, and city staff
- Provide watershed-wide coordination of activities and watershed "point of contact" for all stakeholders

Bassett Creek WMC Watershed Management Plan

- 1982: Metropolitan Surface Water Management Act to manage creeks on watershed boundaries
- Oversight and technical assistance provided by: MN Board of Water and Soil Resources
- Partner with multiple agencies and stakeholders (cities, residents, BWSR, MPCA, DNR, Met Council, Park Boards/District, lake associations)
- 2004: Last Watershed Management Plan developed
- 2013-2014: Updating Watershed Management Plan




3. How do you use the lakes, streams, ponds and wetlands in your community or surrounding communities? (Choose all that apply)




4. How important are the lakes, streams, wetlands and ponds to your quality of life in your community?

Bassett Creek WMC Issues Identified

- Hundreds of responses gathered through small group meetings and survey
- All comments, suggestions, issues and concerns were read, sorted, and combined with similar issues
- Broader topics identified
 - Degraded habitats & lack of biodiversity
 - Lack of education and information
 - Recreation needs
 - Degraded water quality
 - Effects of storm water runoff and development
 - Water quantity, water levels, flooding (aside from Medicine Lake levels)
 - Medicine Lake levels
 - Actions by individuals
 - Governance, management & funding
 - Groundwater
