2. COMMUNICATIONS & UPDATES

A. Channel Maintenance Funds – see attached

Reminder that channel maintenance funds are available to cities with a portion of the trunk system in their community. See attached memo with 2024 availability.

B. AIS Prevention Signs – see attachment

AIS prevention signs specifically for fishing piers (targeting anglers) and canoe carry-in access/storage areas (targeting paddlers) were recently developed by Hennepin County with the BCWMC Administrator's input and review by the Education Committee. Input and assistance will be needed from cities to determine appropriate locations and sizes for city piers and access sites (or canoe storage areas).

3. BUSINESS

A. Discuss H&H Model Update and Platform – see attachment

The Commission Engineer recommends updates to the Commission-approved watershed-wide hydrologic and hydraulic model including converting the XPSWMM model to PCSWMM and incorporating Atlas 15 events and new information on area impervious coverage, topography, precipitation, and stormwater infrastructure. D. Watershed Based Implementation Funds

Cities in the Bassett Creek watershed should appoint two representatives to participate in the official convene process for the FY24-25 Watershed Based Implementation Funds (WBIF) from BWSR. Funds will be available starting July 1st. An official "convene" meeting should be held in the next few months. The Bassett Creek watershed was allocated \$183,256 which must be spent on targeted, prioritized, and measurable activities that are listed in an approved plan's implementation section and which have a water quality benefit. Counties, cities, and the BCWMC are all eligible grant recipients. The convene meeting should include two staff or officials representing cities to help decide where the funds should be allocated.
