A. REVIEW FINAL RESULTS FROM STREET SWEEPING PRIORITIZATION ANALYSIS

At the June TAC meeting, Commission Engineers reviewed results from the street sweeping survey and initial study results. The TAC provided input on adjustments to survey results and other study assumptions.

The Commission Engineers are preparing the final report to present at the Commission's August meeting. At this TAC meeting, Commission Engineers will review the final results of the analysis, discuss results from the prioritization exercise, share results of impacts of street sweeping on chlorides, and discuss recommendations and next steps. Staff is seeking TAC input towards the final report.

B. BASSETT CREEK LAGOON DREDGING PROJECT – PRELIMINARY FEASIBILITY STUDY SCOPE – see memo attached with meeting materials

The Commission should begin feasibility studies for 2027 CIP projects later this year. Staff is seeking input on the appropriate elements, tasks, and considerations for the feasibility study scope of work which will be presented for the Commission's consideration at their August 21st meeting. C. WEST METRO WATER ALLIANCE – PLANNING FOR ITS FUTURE – see presentation attached with meeting materials

The West Metro Water Alliance (WMWA) is a coalition of multiple watersheds (including BCWMC) who pool funding to collaborate on education and outreach activities. The group was formalized in 2010 when SCWMC, BCWMC, and ECWMC entered into an agreement and adopted the West Metro Education and Outreach Plan which identifies stakeholders and messages, education goals, and evaluation metrics. BCWMC contributes \$15,000/year to WMWA. WMWA partners are currently working on a strategic planning exercise to create a more formal structure and evolve education programming to fill education gaps and provide more robust education resources to the watersheds and member cities. Input is being sought from cities in each watershed. The attached slides provide an overview of WMWA activities along with some questions for TAC members to consider.
